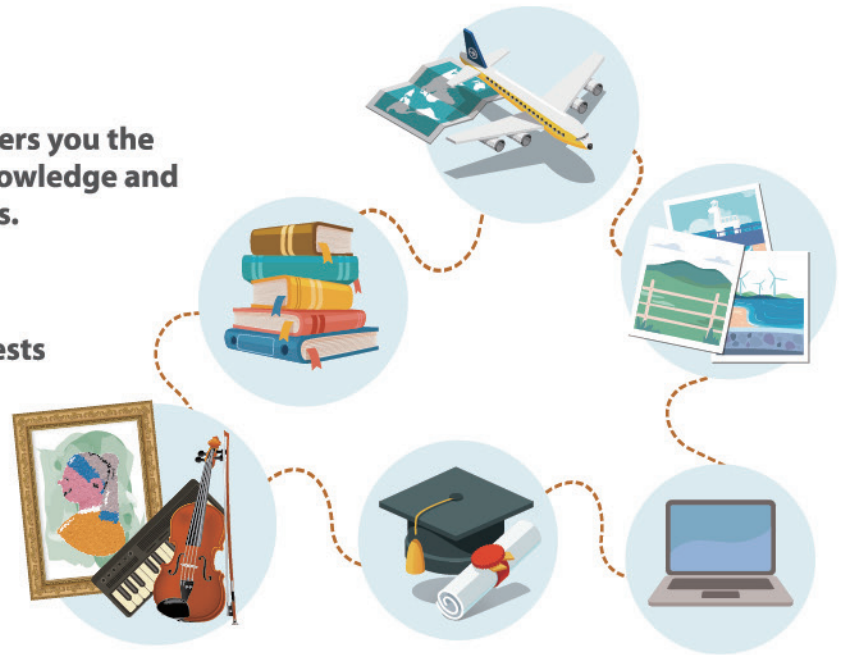
The four-year Bachelor of Arts programme offers you the opportunity to explore and enhances your knowledge and experience in the scope of arts and humanities.

LIBERAL AND FLEXIBLE CURRICULUM

You may pursue an additional Arts/non-Arts major, and/or up to two minors. Having a liberal and flexible curriculum, you are able to develop your individual study programmes within a guided and academically coherent framework at Years 2 to 4.

STUDENT GLOBAL EXPERIENCE

The Faculty offers a wide range of opportunities of experiential learning globally, e.g. student exchange, field trips, internships and short-term study abroad programmes. A number of Arts programmes incorporate experiential learning in their credit-bearing courses and some organise non-credit-bearing experiential learning activities for their students.

YOUNG GLOBAL LEADER AWARD

Global and Area Studies (GLAS) is a new major offered by the School of Modern Languages and Cultures from 2024-25 onwards. A cash award of HK\$10,000 will be granted to selected Bachelor of Arts students who intend to major in Global and Area Studies and demonstrate outstanding academic performance.



FACULTY OF ARTS ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP FOR BACHELOR OF ARTS PROGRAMMES

If your total score in your 2024 HKDSE^{1 & 2} English Language and Best 4 subjects is 33.5 or above (based on HKU Scoring System#) and you are admitted to the Bachelor of Arts (JS6054) or Bachelor of Arts in Humanities and Digital Technologies (JS6286), you will be offered an entrance scholarship awarded by the Faculty of Arts.
